## **PURPOSE AND ACTIONS**

#### ABOUT THE FIP FOUNDATION FOR EDUCATION AND RESEARCH

The FIP Foundation for Education and Research is a not-for-profit organisation that was established in 1993. Our Foundation programmes and activities align with the overall goals of FIP and across the areas of education, practice and science. Our current programmes and offerings focus on research grants, leadership development scholarships, and Pharmabridge connections and collaborations. Future innovative programmes will advance the objective to support and advance FIP priorities. A copy of our 2022–2024 Strategic Plan can be found at our website.

FIP members, stakeholders and supporters sustain FIP Foundation work through donations and sponsorships. Your donations remain critical to the Foundation's success for the continuation and growth of our programme offerings.

**Vision:** The FIP Foundation shares the same vision as FIP — envisioning a world where everyone benefits from access to safe, effective, quality and affordable medicines and health technologies, as well as from pharmaceutical care services provided by pharmacists, in collaboration with other healthcare professionals.

**Mission:** As the FIP Foundation, our work supports the mission of FIP — to improve global health by inspiring philanthropy that drives education and research, leadership development, connections and collaborations, and other new initiatives to advance the profession of pharmacy and our patients' health.

## RESEARCH

The FIP Foundation supports and fosters research activities through grants, research incubation and the development of collaborative research partnerships among and between the Foundation and other FIP units such as sections, special interest groups, FIPEd, the Board of Pharmaceutical Practice, the Board of Pharmaceutical Sciences, and the Early Career Pharmaceutical Group (ECPG).

### FIP Foundation and ECPG Innovation Research Grant

The Foundation, together with the FIP ECPG, awards a grant of EUR 1,000 to encourage innovation in pharmacy by a young pharmacist or pharmaceutical scientist who has limited resources for their own research. Projects can stem from any field of pharmacy (practice, science or education) but must focus on innovation that improves the practice of pharmacy or the advancement of pharmaceutical science with direct clinical application. The grant has been awarded annually since 2002 and supports the implementation of the recipient's project. The recipient also receives travel support to attend the FIP world congress and present project results.



**Brian Cicali,** of Florida, USA, won the FIP Foundation and ECPG Innovation Research Grant in 2022. He will conduct a research project titled "Model-informed evidence approach for pediatric and neonate dosing of tramadol". Results will be reported at the 2023 FIP world congress in September 2023.



### LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

The Foundation focuses on leadership development with the objectives of building strong future leadership for FIP, while also helping develop leaders in practice, education and science who will drive advances for the profession. Enhancing leadership development efforts will create professional leaders for FIP who are versatile and forward-thinking, guiding us to achieve significant milestones as ONE FIP. We are committed to empowering individuals to be successful change leaders in their pharmacy practice, academic and pharmaceutical scientist careers, allowing them to realise their full potential.

In 2022, the FIP Foundation supported several activities in collaboration with the Young Pharmacists Group, now called the Early Career Pharmaceutical Group (ECPG), to provide leadership development for early career pharmacists and pharmaceutical scientists. We look forward to continuing our partnership and leadership development activities with ECPG in 2023.

## The YPG (now the Early Career Pharmaceutical Group) Leadership Development Workshop (LDW) at FIP world congress

The LDW continues as a collaboration with both the ECPG and the Academic Pharmacy Section. The LDW is designed to help build and develop leadership skills that early career pharmacists and pharmaceutical scientists can use in future endeavours. The Foundation provided funds for all registration fees at the 2022 FIP world congress.

## The Foundation/YPG (now the Early Career Pharmaceutical Group) Leadership Development Scholarship

The Foundation provides a scholarship for travel and lodging (EUR 2,500) for a Leadership Development Workshop attendee. The 2022 Scholarship was awarded to Khalid Garba Mohammed, from Nigeria, and supported his travel and participation in the annual ECPG LDW and the FIP world congress.

## The Foundation Ton Hoek Scholarship

The Ton Hoek Scholarship for young leaders allows a young pharmacist or pharmaceutical scientist to travel to an FIP congress to develop, or to help others to develop, skills and knowledge in line with the objectives of the Foundation, promoting global guidance and inspiration. The award is named after the late Ton Hoek (1955–2012), a former FIP CEO. The 2020 recipient, Lucas Ercolin, received the scholarship award and was recognised at the 2022 FIP world congress.

### CONNECTIONS AND COLLABORATIONS: PHARMABRIDGE

Through the Pharmabridge programme, the FIP Foundation supports and fosters global connections and collaborations to strengthen pharmacy practice, education and science. Pharmabridge supports professional development of educators, scientists and those in pharmacy practice from the developing world by organising exchanges, facilitating connections and offering books. The programme, started by Dr Agathe Wehrli in 1993, has supported more than 2,000 registrants from over 30 low-income to date.



#### **Exchanges**

Placements for experiential learning visits are matched between registrants and hosts based on the specific needs of individuals.

#### Books

Complimentary copies of the "American Hospital Formulary Service Drug Information" books are sent to every new Pharmabridge registrants from LIDCs. We are grateful to the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists and others for their continued generous donation of books.

#### Connections

Some registrants are seeking support in a specific issue or area. In these cases, Pharmabridge assists with contacts to FIP Sections/SIGS or specialists in the field.

#### Activities in 2022

- There were 27 registrations to the programme from thirteen different countries, including Afghanistan, Botswana, Cameroon, Ethiopia, Ghana, India, Iraq, Nigeria, Oman, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, Sudan and Zimbabwe.
- Nine individuals were connected to an FIP section or SIG or to experts and specialists in a specific area or field.
- During the 2022 FIP world congress, programming highlighted Pharmabridge hosts and registrants as they shared their experiences. Future collaboration was also discussed. In addition, a poster describing the impact of Pharmabridge was presented at the congress.
- Two Pharmabridge newsletters with updates and information were sent to more than 2,000 individuals, including registrants, hosts and all leaders of the FIP SIGs and sections.
- The Pharmabridge database was transferred to FIP headquarters. Continued work is in progress to improve database operations and efficiency.

In the future, the Foundation plans to extend the activity of Pharmabridge through enhanced virtual connection capabilities as well as efforts targeted to connecting groups with common expertise and interests.

### COMMUNICATIONS

In 2022, the Foundation significantly increased outreach and communications to FIP members though an updated website (fipfoundation.org), newsletters, and the FIP world congress programming and exhibition. The website now highlights our work on priority themes, and donations can now be made using a debit or credit card. Several website links were created with our programme partner, the ECPG, to better promote applications for our scholarships and research grants. The quarterly Foundation newsletters provide FIP members with ongoing awareness of our activities. Two Pharmabridge newsletters updated those who are involved as either hosts or registrants of the programme. Our Foundation outreach efforts at the 2022 FIP world congress included three educational programmes, Foundation and Pharmabridge posters, and an exhibition stand. Thank you to those who participated in programme discussions and to those who visited our exhibition stand to make donations. We hope to see you all again at the 2023 world congress in Brisbane.
